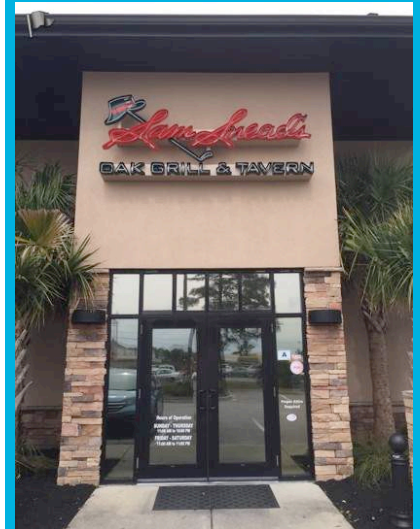

## Our Newest Member!

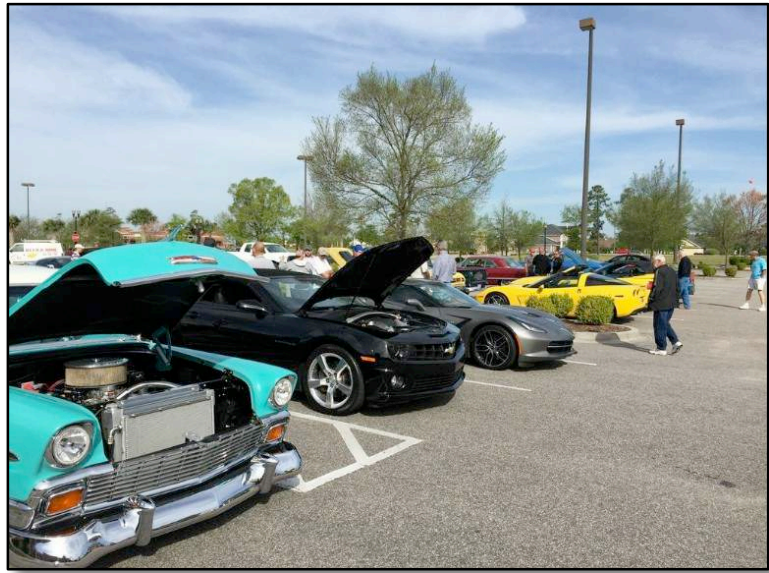

### Ron's Tuna Surprise

#### Ingredients:

3 small cans of tuna fish (water packed)

2 boxes of Kraft Macaroni and Cheese

Mayonnaise or Miracle Whip (your choice)

1 small jar of sweet pickle relish

1 very large serving bowl with lid

#### Directions:

Follow directions on box to prepare the macaroni and cheese and place in the large serving bowl.

While the noodles are cooking, drain the tuna.

Add 1/2 cup of mayonnaise (or Miracle Whip if you like it sweeter) to the macaroni and cheese and mix well (add more to taste).

Add 1 cup of sweet pickle relish to the macaroni and cheese and mix well (add more for sweeter taste).

Add tuna to mac and cheese and mix well.

Serve immediately, while still warm, as a main dish, or, cover with lid, refrigerate, and serve cold as a salad.

This dish was "invented" on a lazy summer afternoon when the question, "What are we having for dinner?" was answered with "All we've got in the cupboard is tuna, relish, and Kraft macaroni," and no one wanted to go shopping! It was so named because it tastes surprisingly good.
