OCTOBER 13, 2019

The October meeting of GSCC was held on October 13 at Red Robin, Myrtle Beach at 4pm. Attendance was 30 members and 1 prospect.

Welcoming and Opening comments made by President George Washnak. George welcomed and thanked members who were in attendance.
